ATFHF OBJECTIVES

Some of the objectives of the organization shall be to:

1. Honor and recognize persons who have made significant contributions to the sports of track and field and cross country in the state of Arkansas;
2. Recognize and encourage Arkansas high school track athletes who have excelled in performance and/or academics;
3. Promote running and other track and field events as a lifetime sport activity throughout the state of Arkansas;
4. Educate the general public on the sports of track and field and cross country, in order to increase participation and recognition;
5. Stimulate improved performance in competitive track and field and cross country.

A Brief History of the ATFHF

The Arkansas Track and Field Hall of Fame was formed in 1992 and inducted its first class in 1995. Up to twenty-one members serve on the ATFHF Board of Directors to guide the organization in its day-to-day business and to see that the membership receives ballots and biographical information for each person named on the Master List and the Senior List. The next class of inductees is chosen by membership votes from these lists with the final confirmation of the board.

ATFHF maintains a Senior List where names and bios are listed for those nominees who are 70 and older. Typically one or two inductees are selected from the Senior List each year.

Nominations to the Master List and the Senior List are solicited from the ATFHF membership. A member may submit a nomination as long as a track bio is sent for that person as well. Names will not be added without a bio telling of the track/field experience, honors and successes of the individual.

As of the 2012 induction held each June 115 individuals have been honored with induction into the Arkansas Track and Field Hall of Fame.

Functions of the Arkansas Track & Field Hall of Fame

ATFHF Annual Induction Banquet

Each year the organization presents for induction four to seven individuals. Inductions have been conducted annually since 1995. Inductees receive a medal and a plaque.

Meritorious Service Awards

At each year's banquet individuals or organizations may be recognized for Meritorious Service to the organization or to Track and Field in the state, in general.

Lewis McCollum Gold Star Schools

Two high school Track and Field programs are recognized each year for excellence in performance, leadership and service that embodies the objectives of ATFHF. These programs are recognized at the banquet with school representatives receiving an engraved plaque.

George Jones Outstanding Male and Female Athletes

George Jones was a big fan of track/XC athletes and especially the multi-event athletes. It was he who constructed the point tables for the Decathlon, then the Pentathlon and later the Heptathlon. The winners of those championships are named as the George Jones Outstanding Male and Female Athletes each year and are presented with an engraved plaque at the annual banquet.

ATFHF Senior Scholarships

One male and one female active track athlete is presented an ATFHF Scholarship based, not only on track and/or cross country participation, but taking into account their leadership and service within the school and community.

All Arkansas and All-Academic Track Athletes

Each year at the banquet the Arkansas Track Coaches Association names and presents engraved plaques to 22 high school track and field and cross country athletes for excellence in performance and/or academics.
